

FIRST SEGMENT OF INTERVIEW

J: It's good, I'm happy for her. Yeah I mean because some girls don't have that kind of like a outlook.

B: So, you know, I might sometimes be addicted to it too. Yeah, yeah, it's also like dependable. It's always there, you know. No matter what. Say I've messed up with something in my life, and I have nothing I can just go stick out my thumb and you know start from there or something.

EV: is that something that you like about the industry or something...

Brittany: It's kind of comfortability with it. The slow days the fun days and chaotic days, but It's fun. Especially, you know, I've been blessed to you know, be with Julie working and in other places. Being at the place I've been, I can see new people, meet new people. It's just been great. I would yeah...that's it. (laughs)

SECOND PART

B: You know, you've got different girls from different walks of like, different aspects and they have no idea what they're doing and then they're usually influenced because of how they started doing this from being influenced by social media.

J: I would not tell the boyfriend nothing. It was no one's business You know, I would say I was doing something else whether it be a phone person somewhere or whatever I was doing, right? But these girls, they get caught like on purpose, get to be careful. And I would never tell a boyfriend that, you know what I mean? I mean, unless it was that type of boyfriend that she met in that business maybe or something, and they know and you guys have a great relationship like that, you know? One of the girls says, "I just ask them, what would you like me to do while we're here? And I just take direction from him." And I'm like, that's not what it is. You know, you can't just do that. It's not, that's just very boring.

EV: Right, and that's not... That's not like [real life]

J: It's like you're acting really. It's just, you know, being at his service. And [the client] wants to know you're having fun too.

J: Oh, that was too much.

EV: Not Not The rabbi, now you have to tell the story.

B: It was a role-play situation. He wanted to roleplay and dirty Talk and all kinds of stuff. He was saying some wild stuff. So I took it up a notch and I was like, well, how about I just be the rabbi to lick your dick a little bit?

J: And he was like oh hell no.

B: I was like, it was just a joke, okay?

EV: Oh, you took it too far?

J: Sometimes, you'll go crazy.

EV: You know where to go.

J: I say turn it up Brittany, get it going! She instigates this shit.

B: I really instigate this shit. I'm alright, let's throw some extra seasoning on, stir it up a little bit.

EV: See y'all help maybe like balance each other out.

B: Absolutely.

J: Yeah, absolutely.

EV: That's where the love is a little bit.

B: It's respect, it's more respect, does respect, the love is always there, it's all love, but it's respect, like we respect each other and... -

EV: You need a leash?
